6425 Blanch Cir. - This amazing mid-century modern ranch-style home overlooks a secluded pond. Built in 1941, it was renovated and expanded in 2014. Upon entering the home, you'll find a modern twist on the retro styles, simple shapes, and sleek lines inspired by the set of "Mad Men". The home features beautiful photography by the homeowner's father, as well as exquisite furnishings and art. Hosted by the LECPTA, the Lakewood Home Festival is a community-wide event that raises funds for Lakewood Elementary School, J.L. Long Middle School and Woodrow Wilson High School. The funds directly benefit students through the purchase of school materials, computers and enrichment programs. Attended by close to 4,000 patrons annually, the Lakewood Home Festival has raised millions of dollars for local schools since 1976. Last year's festival, alone, raised \$155,000 for the three schools, setting a new record.

New This Year: Original Lakewood Home Festival Artwork

The LECPTA is proud to announce that starting this year, local artist Walter Soza of <u>SozaDesigns Studios</u> joins forces with the LECPTA as the official artist of the Annual Lakewood Home Festival. Soza's artwork can already be found in homes throughout Lakewood, but for the first time this year, the artist designed an original piece of art to be featured on the cover of the Home Tour Ticket Book, which itself becomes a larger keepsake for tour-goers this year.

The original piece of art for 2015 features a window that pays tribute to many of the prominent stained-glass windows found in many historic Lakewood homes designed by the late architect, Clifford D. Soza has lived in Lakewood for more than 15 years, "the longest I've lived anywhere in the world," he said. "I was married in Lakewood to my beautiful wife Tammy, and have a son and a daughter who is due any minute now. I've been dedicated to my local community. I think Lakewood Elementary School is a special little gem that values the education of our children and embraces the families in our neighborhood. I will help however I can in raising money to make our local school facilities and education top notch. I also want to help preserve the local historic landmarks as a reminder to future generations of how the neighborhood has evolved."
