Upon entering the property down the long, winding, gravel driveway visitors are transported from the city to a serene countryside estate complete with trails, bridges, wildlife, and the family dog, Duke, roaming freely. After acquiring it in 1999, the homeowners went to great lengths to preserve and return Lakewood's famed "Hidden Jewel" to its former glory. The homeowner continues to maintain a deep appreciation

for American architecture and design. His wife had been the president of Preservation Dallas prior to her untimely passing in 2009. The home, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, is rich in character and full of history.
